

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# Inter-House Cross Country Carnival



#### **Brought Nothing In, Take Nothing Out**

I wonder what are the most important things in life for you? Perhaps it is climbing the corporate ladder, living comfortably and ensuring that you take an overseas holiday each year? Or maybe keeping up-to-date with the latest tech gadgets and not missing out on what is trending that will add ease to your life?

I have spent the past few weeks in Sydney attending to my father in hospital who was dying. He was 87, lived a beautiful life, and incidentally, wanted for nothing. Although he lacked for nothing, his possessions meant very little to dad. What mattered most on this earth to him was the relationships he shared with his family and friends. The attendance at his funeral was a testimony to this fact. People came from everywhere to my father's funeral, many whom my mother had never laid eyes on before.

Dad valued each and every friendship that he had slowly nurtured and always made others feel special. He had time for others. To listen. To love. To meet their need in some practical way. I was inspired to re-evaluate the friendships that I have and remember to hold each of them with very high regard. Dad knew that he brought nothing into this world and he would take nothing out. Accumulating deep lasting friendships, rather than accumulating more possessions was at the very heart of who he was.

Perhaps, like me, you have spent too much time on the wrong sorts of things. You have let slip the very thing that matters most – people, not possessions. We all need a reminder from time to time when we let the stuff we own take precedent over the people we know. May this be a gentle reminder to all who read this article, including the author herself, that we diligently take time to show respect, love and genuine interest to those who are most dear and precious in our lives.
