HEALTHY CHOICES

Mini Bacon Frittatas

4 rashers bacon, diced 4 large eggs ¼ cup milk ¼ teaspoon salt 2 teaspoons fresh parsley leaves 2/3 cup shredded cheese Few drops tabasco sauce, to taste



Heat the oven to 180 C.

Spray muffin cups with nonstick cooking spray In a large skillet over medium heat, brown the bacon. Drain. In a medium bowl, whisk the eggs and milk until well blended. Add the salt, parsley and tabasco. Mix well.

Add the bacon and ½ cup of the shredded cheese to the mixture. Fill the prepared muffin cups about two-thirds full. Sprinkle the remaining cheese over the filled muffin cups.

Bake for 18-22 minutes or until the frittatas have puffed and set. Remove the pan to a rack and use a knife or spatula to loosen the sides. Lift them out onto a plate to cool.
